

Guidelines and FAQs

This document outlines tips for applying to the scheme, the application questions for you to read through before beginning <u>your online</u> <u>application</u>, frequently asked questions, and our privacy policy.





Tips for Applying

- Double check you are applying for the correct Grierson DocLab scheme. There are three schemes: the core Grierson DocLab scheme, Grierson DocLab In Focus: Editing and Grierson DocLab In Focus: Production Management.
- Read the question and then read it again.
- We are seeking individuals who watch and have passion for a range of factual programmes on different platforms, not limited to online or feature documentaries, so make sure to tell us about the variety of content that you watch. Your first jobs in the industry could involve editing content for the BBC, VICE, Channel 4, Channel 5, Discovery, as well as working on Netflix productions.
- Check your application and CV, then check it again. If you have invested your valuable time to apply, you do not want to be let down by poor grammar or spelling mistakes. Do not rely on spell check. Ask a friend/colleague/teacher/tutor/youth-worker to look over it for you too. Please also save your CV pdf file as your full name so we can match it to your application easily.
- Tailor your CV to show us the technical skills on Avid or Premier Pro that you have to progress in a career as an offline editor, as well as demonstrating the soft skills you need to be working as a successful editor. - Research and read up about the industry. Here are some useful sites: <u>BAFTA Guru</u>; <u>ScreenSkills</u> and <u>So You Want to Work in TV?</u>





Application Questions

To apply to Grierson DocLab In Focus: Editing 2021, you will need to <u>fill out the application form online</u>.

We recommend reading through the questions below and drafting your answers offline first, before beginning the online application, as you cannot save to return and finish at a later date. Once you have completed the online application, please ensure you have received your confirmation email (this may go to your junk folder, so please check there).

- Tell us what range of single documentaries or series you have watched over the last 12 months. Please describe why you have chosen them, and critique aspects of the editing choices in two of your examples. (300 words) Working to become an offline editor, you need to watch, understand and appreciate the art and craft of the edit. We want to read about what you watch and what makes these films or programmes stand out creatively for you. You may touch upon technical aspects, but this is a chance to explain why the selections work as examples of great filmmaking.
- Why do you want to become a documentary film editor? (250 words) What makes you want to be an editor? What are the drivers? Was there a lightbulb moment, or something you watched that made you think this is what you want to be? What has motivated and inspired you to apply for this scheme? What skills do you have that would make you a great editor?
- Can you tell us about the barriers you have faced in terms of career progression to meet your ambition to become an offline editor? (250 words) What has prevented you from progressing in your chosen career? Is it about the access to networks? Opportunities available to you? Your location? Access to training? What can you identify that has hindered your ambition to become an offline editor?





 The Grierson Trust supports groups that are under-represented in the world of factual and documentary programme-making. How do you feel you fit into this and would therefore benefit from being on the Grierson DocLab In Focus: Editing scheme? (250 words max) We want to support the work of the industry to reflect the full diversity of the UK population, and this is your opportunity to tell us how you identify your diversity. Give us reasons why you believe you should be chosen. How will you benefit from the scheme? What will being selected mean to you?

We also recommend preparing the following:

- Your CV ready to upload once you have applied online, making sure it is in pdf format and that the file is saved as your full name.
- Two reference contact details (email addresses and telephone numbers).

The online application also includes questions for monitoring purposes.

FAQs

- **Do I have to use up all the word count?** You do not necessarily need to use the full allocation, but we do expect a fully formed response. We want to feel your passion on the page.
- Why do I have to complete the monitoring form? The monitoring section of the application form helps us capture information about applicants that feeds into our reporting to funders. The reporting is a condition of securing our funding that enables to do the work supporting trainees. You can read about why monitoring matters <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>. Once submitted, your name is removed, and the data will be anonymised.





- I am currently at university can I apply? You cannot be in fulltime education when applying for this scheme.
- I am going to be applying to study for a masters in the next academic year (2021-2022), can I apply? The scheme is to make trainees ready to take up work opportunities and therefore if you intend to take up a masters, you are not eligible. The scheme is geared to help you with contacts and knowledge to get into the industry to work. Starting a course means the momentum and introductions we create for you cannot be followed through.
- I did not study film or media, nor do I have experience in the industry, is this an issue? Not at all. It does not matter what you have studied, the most important thing is to convey your passion for factual programme-making why you want a job as an offline editor in the industry. We have had trainees on past Grierson DocLab schemes from a variety of backgrounds who have studied many different subjects. The Grierson DocLab In Focus: Editing scheme criteria asks that you have strong technical editing skills and are proficient with either Avid or Premier Pro. The training course will be run on Avid and will require operational knowledge of how to ingest files, bin structure, cutting tools, grouping/syncing and exporting media, as well as an understanding of the importance of the EDL (edit decision list).
- My CV is very short, or I don't have a CV. Your CV is important for us to see information that
 may not be on the application form, including your technical editing ability. So, length is not
 an issue, but making sure you have listed everything to show your experiences, interests,
 subjects studied, technical skills etc. is. Don't forget to show us your transferable <u>soft skills</u>
 that you have developed, over and beyond your technical competencies. There are many
 great online resources and websites to help you write your CV or to strengthen what you do
 have. See the section on tips for applying for links.
- I can't attend some of the dates. Can I still apply? You have to be available to attend all parts of the programme as listed in the schedule. There will be no exceptions.





- When do I have to do the placement? I have some holidays and other commitments in the diary. You will have until the end of the year 2021 to undertake the placement. This is arranged on an individual basis. Variables include your availability, the company you are placed with having a suitable role for you and it being at a time that suits both parties.
- I have never been to university or college. Will this be a barrier? No. We welcome applications from anyone who can demonstrate their passion for documentaries.
- Why are only UK residents eligible to submit an application? This scheme is designed to get trainees into jobs in the UK, so it is essential that we prioritise applicants who can and want to work in the UK.
- What happens after the training ends? As long as you keep in touch with us, as we hope you will, we will continue to support you through the mentoring programme, one-to-one contact with the Director of Training Programmes, invitations to partner events and networking opportunities.
- Who are your mentors? Established industry professionals including our board of <u>Trustees</u>.
- **Can I get feedback if my application is unsuccessful?** Due to the high volume of applications, we are unable to provide any feedback.
- If I am selected for the scheme, as someone with accessibility issues, what support can I expect? We are aware that some trainees may need additional support. We have a specific





member of the team who has responsibility for establishing the access needs of all participants, who will work closely with you.

• How do you make sure the assessment of applications is inclusive and fair? The Grierson Trust is committed to encouraging diversity and inclusion in all its work. We first assess all applications 'blind' by taking off all applicant information apart from the answers to the main application question and assigning each applicant a number. This is to tackle any unconscious biases. You can read our diversity and inclusion statement <u>on our website</u>.

Privacy Policy

By submitting this application for Grierson DocLab In Focus: Editing 2021 ("Application") you ("Applicant") hereby acknowledge and agree that The Grierson Trust ("Company") shall collect, use and otherwise process certain personal data submitted by and relating to Applicant for purposes connected with the Application, including Company assessing and reviewing the Application and complying with legal and regulatory obligations.
